MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER – ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Chief Probation Officer Alan Crogan at 1:33 p.m.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Alan Crogan entertained a motion to approve the February 7, 2012 minutes of the Community Corrections Partnership Executive Committee (CCPEC) meeting. Motion was moved by Gary Windom, and seconded by Jerry Wengerd. Alan Crogan reported a correction to page 3, section 5e under Probation staff report; the correct number of intakes completed should read 1,506. Motion was modified by Gary Windom, and seconded by Jerry Wengerd. Alan Crogan requested a roll call vote of the motion which passed as follows:

3. REVOCATION HEARING TRAINING AND CONSULTATION- DISCUSSION ITEM

Stan Sniff arrived to the meeting at 1:36 p.m.

Paul Zellerbach reported that he spoke to both Assistant Chief Probation Officer Mark Hake and Gary Windom in regards to utilizing Retired Deputy Commissioner, Board of Prison Terms, Steve Hernandez for training and consultation. They are in agreement to the idea and invited the Courts to join them in the training. Alan Crogan explained that this agenda item was not an action item, and referred the matter to the Revocation work group who will then contact Mr. Hernandez and create a training packet.

4. INFORMATION SHARING WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT: UPDATE - DISCUSSION ITEM

Chief Deputy Probation Officer Bryce Hulstrom reported that he is in receipt of the Association of Riverside County Chief of Police (ARCCOP) letter and it has been signed by everyone except for Stan Sniff who had not received the letter for signature prior to this meeting. It was suggested that Paul Zellerbach's signature be added to the letter. Bryce Hulstrom stated that he sent out an email requesting the agency contact persons and zip codes under their jurisdictions be sent to him immediately. Effective Wednesday, March 7, 2012, the list of all AB 109 releases from October 1, 2011 to March 6, 2012 will be sent to all agencies involved. On Monday, March 12, 2012, the weekly list will be distributed. Patrick Williams shared his concerns on how the data will be requested and distributed. Alan Crogan further explained the Probation Department's process and reasoning for the information sharing procedure.

5. STAFF REPORTS – DISCUSSION ITEMS

- a) CHIEF OF POLICE: Patrick Williams reported that the Beaumont office is almost complete. The task force worked with the probation officer assigned yesterday and completed compliance checks as well as having three arrests. Patrick Williams would like to have Task Force Sergeant Jim Anderson from Hemet Police Department come to the next meeting to give a presentation. The presentation will be added to the April 3, 2011 CCPEC agenda.
- b) COURT: Not in attendance.
- c) DISTRICT ATTORNEY: Paul Zellerbach reported on Senate Bill 1441, introduced by Senator Emmerson and explained that anyone who is sentenced for more than three years would go to prison. He is currently working on getting this bill passed. He also reported that he is continuing to work with the Courts on the informal pre-hearing conferences that are being held in Riverside. Lastly, he has spoken to the Sheriff's Department on the subject of "early releases" and they are working together to develop a system to provide the District Attorney's office notification of any early releases.
- d) MENTAL HEALTH: Jerry Wengerd reported that there are 270 referrals in their system. He is tracking the cost of health and mental health. The biggest emphasis is hiring staff in jail services. They have hired 10 positions in Mental Health, Drug and Alcohol and in the jail services.
- e) PROBATION: Division Director Bill Palmer distributed, reviewed, and discussed the *AB 109 Statistics*, dated as of March 2, 2012.
 - Total packets received from CDCR: 1,956
 - Number of Post-release Community Supervision (PrCS) & Supervised Release (SR) cases: 1,274
 - Total PrCS warrants: 152
 - Current Outstanding PrCS Warrants: 80
 - PrCS Revocation Petitions: 226
 - Flash Incarcerations: 46

Bill Palmer also reviewed the *PrCS Population by City* as of March 2, 2012 and the *Supervised Release (SR) Population by City* as of February 21, 2012.

- f) PUBLIC DEFENDER: Gary Windom stated that they are continuing to resolve the issues with coordinating their new PrCS cases. Assistant Public Defender Christine Voss stated that they have met with the PrCS work group, individual meetings with the court and with Judge Levine. They are making more effort to bring the people who are in custody into court earlier on in the process which is resulting in some success. Christine Voss also mentioned that there is a new continuance form that will be used for the PrCS cases.
- g) SHERIFF: Stan Sniff stated that he and Undersheriff Colleen Walker will not be in attendance at the next CCPEC meeting on April 3, 2012. Chief Deputy Jerry Gutierrez distributed and reviewed the *AB 109 Impact Update* as of March 3, 2012 as followed:
- CDCR Commit - Parole Revocation (Pre October 1, 2011) pending pick up: 37 inmates
 - Riverside Sheriff's Department Commit - Parole Revocation (Post October 1, 2011) AB 109 Impact: 2,099 inmates
 - Flash Incarceration : 48
 - PrCS Violation: 123
 - Total Sentenced Commit: 3,497 inmates
AB 109 Impact: 751 inmates

Jerry Gutierrez also reported that he will be presenting at the next Riverside County Law Enforcement Administrators Association (RCLEAA) meeting. He will be discussing the federal releases, tracking, electronic confinement, and sharing a report with the District Attorney and Public Defender, which they are currently providing to the judges.

Stan Sniff reported on the expansion of the jails and stated that the Building Services and Executive Office are getting ready to submit the Form 11 for the Capital Improvement Plan which includes the request to expand the Indio Jail by a minimal of 1,200 beds and the second is to support between 1,200-2,400 beds in Whitewater. There may not be enough money to support the two requests. He said that the Board of Supervisors appear to have more interest in revisiting this issue.

6. PUBLIC COMMENTS (NON AGENDA ITEMS)

There were no public comments.

7. NEXT MEETING

The next CCPEC meeting will be held on April 3, 2012, 1:30 p.m., Downtown Law Building, 5th Floor.

Alan Crogan entertained a motion to adjourn; motion was made by Stan Sniff, and seconded by Gary Windom. The meeting was adjourned at 2:42 p.m.
